Homelessness Prevention: The Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing programs provide financial assistance and services to prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless and help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized

IDA: Individual Development Accounts are matched savings accounts that encourage low-income people to save money and gain assets.

REALL: Youth poverty simulation designed for youth in grades 7th-12th grades that allows students to see the difference in reactive and proactive lives.

Rental Assistance: Available on the first business day of each month as funding is available; applicants should call 501-329-2667 beginning at 8:00am until 10:00am.

Utility Assistance: The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) assists eligible persons with their utility bills. **Assurance 16** provides energy efficiency and financial literacy education to participants in the HEAP program, participation is limited. Eligible participants may be eligible to receive a fan from our **Fan Program.**

Weatherization: The Weatherization Program uses computerized audits and diagnostic technology to determine the energy-conservation needs of a home.

FIRST CONSIDERATION – PLEASE READ

- Residents who have already established a good patient-dentist relationship should explain their financial limitations to their dentist and request the most cost-effective treatment plan estimate before changing dentists.
- There is often more than one treatment plan that will achieve the goal of oral health. It is generally better to stick with a dentist one trusts and who knows the patient's needs as well as their medical and dental history.
- The practice's financial manager may be able to work out an acceptable payment schedule according to the patient's ability to pay for services.

 - While in residential treatment, Veterans receive weekly case management and are linked to VA and community programs and services to assist them in meeting their needs and helping them to escape homelessness.
 - Veterans agree to maintain complete sobriety while in residential treatment, and many are participating in HCHV SUD outpatient treatment and/or SUD groups at Fort Roots VA.

• Supported Housing

- Designed to assist Veterans with obtaining affordable housing in the community, through either private property owners or government housing programs.
 - Veterans seeking assistance through this program must agree to participate in identified aftercare programs and receive on-going case management followup from the program coordinator for a specified period.

HUD-VASH

- Joint venture between Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and VA. This program began in 1992.
 - Veterans who participate in the program receive a housing voucher that subsidizes their rent.
 - Veterans interested in the program must also agree to aftercare involvement, as well as close follow-up from the program.
 - Individuals must meet the low-income threshold and must not have a record as a sex offender.
 - Unlike traditional Section 8 Housing Vouchers, individuals with a felony background may utilize HUD-VASH vouchers.

- Health Care for Re-Entry Veterans (HVRC)
 - This program focuses on incarcerated Veterans in Arkansas State and Federal Prison Systems.
 - Its intent is to provide these Veterans with linkages to VA and community resources to help them make a smooth transition back into mainstream society and to prevent street homelessness.
- Veterans Justice Outreach (VJO)
 - This program is designed to assist Veterans incarcerated in local jails with transitioning into the community and gaining access to VA services to address their clinical needs and work toward improving their stability.
